Health Office Important Reminders

June, 2011

Dear Parent or Guardian,

REMINDER to Parents of Students Entering 7th Grade: STATE LAW MANDATES that students entering Grade 7 in September **MUST HAVE**, update of **Tdap/TD**, a series of 3 Hepatitis B Vaccine, 2 doses of MMR, 3 doses of Polio, 2 doses of Varicella or your physician's verification (month and year) of having had Varicella (Chicken Pox). Please mail proof of these immunizations to the school nurse. Your student will not be allowed to begin 7th grade until he/she is in compliance with the Massachusetts Department of Public Health.

REMINDER to Parents of Students Entering 8th Grade: Your student must have an eighth grade physical within one year of the eighth grade school year. Please send a copy of your health care provider's finding to the school nurse to update his/her records.

To All Athletes: Student who intend to try out for school sports-track, basketball, cheerleading, field hockey, and baseball need to have a current physical examination report on file in the school nurses' office. The updated physical examination report must be complete and dated by the physician within one year of the beginning of the sport's season. **Students cannot tryout for any sports team without this report being on file at school.** All students are required to have their parent or guardian complete the green Athletic Eligibility Form which is available in the front office. A separate form must be filed for **each** sport in which the student wished to participate.

School Policy requires the renewal of all medication orders and/or allergic reaction status each school year. A Physician Medication Order/Parent Consent form needs to be completed by your child's physician and by you for all prescription **and** most counter medications you desire your child to receive at school. The completed form and medication needs to be returned to school by a responsible adult (not by student). *Please remember that any medication brought to school by a student will be confiscated and will not be administered.* It will not be returned to the student. Cough drops and TUMS are examples of medications that are not permitted to be in student's possession. If a student needs a cough drop, the nurse has non-medicated throat drops. Medication forms will be available in the front office. Any student who has medications in the nurse's office, the parents will receive new Medication forms at the end of the year.

PLEASE NOTE: Medications on file this year must be picked up by a responsible adult no later than June 22, 2011. **ALL MEDICATIONS NOT PICKED UP WILL BE DISCARDED** regardless of expiration date.
